# 48 Diverse Law Students Successfully Complete ACBA Summer Clerkship Program

*Record Number of In-Person Students and Employers Participate in  
Pittsburgh's Premier Pipeline for Future Diverse Attorneys*

**PITTSBURGH** – The 2023 installment of the ACBA Summer Clerkship Program (SCP) – regarded as the Pittsburgh Legal Community's premier pipeline for future diverse attorneys – concluded last month, the most successful summer in the program's 18-year history.

A total of 48 diverse law students were placed with participating Pittsburgh-area employers, including law firms, corporate legal departments, nonprofits, legal services organizations and governmental legal departments. That is a record for the number of students receiving in-person positions through the program.

"The Summer Clerkship Program is one of the Allegheny County Bar Association's premier initiatives, and this summer's edition was our most successful to date. That is something our entire bar association can be very proud of," said ACBA President Marla Presley. "The SCP has so much momentum. I expect we will continue to see an increase in the number of participating students and employers, and this program will make an even bigger impact."

"It is exciting to see the Summer Clerkship Program continue to grow and flourish," said Kellie Ware, the ACBA's Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. "Literally hundreds of diverse attorneys in the Pittsburgh-area have participated in the SCP. We're now seeing lawyers who came through the program as students hiring through the program as employers. It's been a key factor in helping diverse law students, who are underrepresented in the profession, get plugged into positions and resources they might not have had access to otherwise. The program helps to build personal and professional connections, it's deepening the diverse talent pool within the Pittsburgh Legal Community."

In addition to the record 48 student participants, 15 new employers came aboard in 2023, bringing the total number of employers committing to participating in the 2023 SCP to 51, also a record number.

Beyond the legal work in their respective positions, SCP participants also took part in a mentoring program with diverse attorneys and attended networking events, an exclusive lunch with Pittsburgh-area judges, a mentor/mentee reception, one-on-one sessions with prominent figures from the Pittsburgh Legal Community, a "career sampler" panel and a reception for immersion in the legal community. Additionally, this year's program included an increased number of social activities such as a Pittsburgh CLO performance, Pittsburgh Pirates game, community service work through Global Links and more opportunities to see what the city has to offer.

In addition to participating employers, the SCP growth was made possible through the sponsorship of Dickie McCamey & Chilcote, Dollar Bank, Reed Smith and the Pittsburgh Legal Diversity and Inclusion Coalition.

## **About the SCP**

Launched in 2005, the ACBA Summer Clerkship Program is open to first-year law students who identify as persons of color, disabled (as defined by the ADA) or as LGBTQ+.

Students must attend the University of Pittsburgh School of Law, Thomas R. Kline School of Law at Duquesne University, Penn State Dickinson School of Law, Penn State Law School – University Park, West Virginia University College of Law, or be an Allegheny County native who attends law school elsewhere but is returning home for the summer.

Students apply to the program at the conclusion of their first semester and interview with potential Pittsburgh-area employers. Following a mutual matching process, students embark on a meaningful legal summer work experience. Each year's students are treated as a cohort with support and supplemental learning, networking, social and enrichment opportunities provided by the ACBA.

Through the program, the ACBA seeks to attract and identify high-potential diverse law students who may become candidates for future employment in Pittsburgh and to integrate them into the Pittsburgh Legal Community. The program adds to the diversity and overall talent of the Pittsburgh Legal Community and the region as a whole. Since 2005, the ACBA has placed more than 365 diverse first-year law students in summer clerkship positions in Pittsburgh.
